St Clair County SS. } Court of Probate, St Clair County, January Term 1835

It is proven to the Satisfaction of the Court by the testimony of Pierre Godin [Peter Godin VAS2833] a respectable Citizen of the County of St Clair, that Jacques Lamarche & Thomas Brady both deceased entered the Service, during the revolution in company with some thirty others, that they joined the Illinois Regiment commanded by Col'l. George Rogers Clarke [sic: George Rogers Clark VAS269], who in consideration of their number, permitted them to elect their own Captain, which they did, and selected Joseph Allery [VAS2223] Captain, that he ever after acted as such, and was not only recognised as such by the company but by the Regiment, until it was discharged; it is further proven that they never received a warrant or warrants for the land promised them, either on the part of the United States, or of the State of Virginia, nor did they ever transfer their claim to it in any manner whatsoever, and they served over three years, but how much longer he cannot tell. It is also proven that the said Jacques Lamarche & Thomas Brady died intestate, and that Josephie LeCompte now living is the only heir at Law of said dec'd he knows of.
