Be it known that Before me Robert [undeciphered] a Justice of the peace in and for said county personally appears Wm Brann Sen'r [William Brann, Sr. S17864] aged eighty three years and made oath in due form of Law that he was well acquainted with Peter Laycock and well Recollects that the said Peter Laycock enlisted in the early part of the Revolutionary War for the Share[?] of three years and Believes that the said Laycock was taken prisoner at the seige of Charlestown [Charleston SC, 12 May 1780] and after being exchanged continued to serve his full term out. He further Believes that he continued in actual service until the final close of the War

In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 29 day of April 1831 Robert [illegible]
