I David Nowlin Clerk of the circuit court of said county do certify that is proven in open court to the satisfaction of the court that the within named Gabriel Marleau and Andrew Marleau were privates in the revolutionary war in the Illinois Regiment commanded by col George Rogers Clark [VAS269], that they served between three and four years when the Regiment was discharged and that they never received a warrant or warrants for the bounty land promised them either on the part of the United States or the State of Virginia nor did they ever transfer claim to it or them in any manner whatever. It is further proven that the said Gabriel Marleau and Andrew Marleau died intestate, and that the within named parties to this instrument are the only heirs
