Be it known that before me, David W Quarles, a justice of the peace in and for the County aforsaid, Samuel Mitchell [W3851], an old, and highly respectable man, well known to me, and entitled to full credit; who made oath, that he was well acquainted with his brother Stephen Mitchell having been a soldier of the revolution, that in 1776, said Stephen enlisted for two years, in the company of Capt. George Lambert [S8810], of the virginia state line, in the county of Bedford; that he served his two years out, and was honorably discharged. that he is deceased; that Patsy Lindsey, wife of, [blank] Lindsey, Charity, wife of Lindsey, John, Chatherine, wife of Lindsey, Charlottle, wife of Lindsey, and Lucy Mitchell, Stephen N. Mitchell, Nancy, wife of Wilson, and Betsey wife of Wm Mitchell are his Children and heirs.
