These are to Certifie that James Pattillo formerly a Sergeant in the 10<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment has duly and faithfully served the Term of three years, for which he was enlisted, in Consequence of which, and at his own request he is hereby discharged from any farther service in the Army of the United States and permitted to return to his home free and unmolested he having rec'd all his bounty, pay, deficiencies of pay and Cloathing, in full of all allowances and provision made by Congress for their Troops, His Receipt for which is on the back hereof, Given under my hand at Philadelphia this 4<sup>th</sup> day of Feb'y 1780 A True Copy J. Pendleton Jr Christian Febiger Colo. Com'dt [VAS675] 2<sup>nd</sup> Virg'a Brigade
