The affidavit of Jesse Sanders Sr [S7440] of the County of Fluvanna. this affiant saith that Nathaniel Payne enlisted during the Revolutionary War in the Company of Capt M Deuet [probably Matthew Jouett BLWt1126-300] in the 7th Regiment under the command of Col Clanahan [sic: Alexander McClenachan VAS2033]. that the said Payne enlisted for Two years & served until his death at the Barracks at Lancaster in the state of Pensylvania. & this affiant was a soldier with him until his death &.

Sworn to before me a justice of the peace for the County of Fluvanna this 25 day of April 1831

I do hereby Certify that I was thirty or Forty years ago well acquainted with Nathaniel Payne, the Brother of Daniel Payne, who now resides in this County (Fluvanna) and that the said Nathaniel was I have frequently understood & have reason to believe, a Soldier, Served in the last Revolutionary war – he died about the date 1800 on the plantation where I then owned. Daniel Payne, the Brother of the s'd Nat'l Payne (Deceased) had two sisters, both of which are since dead, & the said Daniel is now very old, and the only surviving one of the Family. [unsigned]
