It is proven to the satisfaction of the Court that the within named Louis Pilette was a private in the revolutionary war, in the Illinois Regiment commanded by Col. George Rogers Clarke [George Rogers Clark VAS269], that he served between three and four years, when the regiment was discharged, and that he never received a warrant for the Bounty Land promised him, either on the Part of the United States or the State of Virginia; nor did he ever transfer his claim to it in any manner whatsoever. It is further proven that the within named Louis Pilette and Angelique Pilette, as represented by their Guardian John B. Laframboise, are the only Heirs left by said Louis Pilette, who died without a will.
