This day Amos Nickens of Northumberland County & State of Virginia appeared before me a Justice of the Peace in he aforesaid County & Made oath that he knew Fortunatus Pittman who formerly resided in the aforesaid county & state aforesaid & that the said Fortunatus Pittman was a Second Lieutenant under Col Thomas [undeciphered] of the aforesaid County & state & served under him during the War of the Revolution & that said Fortunatus Pittman was ordered to March to Urbanna in Middlesex County in the state of Virginia & served during the continuation of the war. Given under my hand this 22nd day of May 1843

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we Fortunatus Anderson, Walter Anderson, Elizabeth Anderson, Mary Anderson, Roxy Pitman, Jesse Pitman, and James Jeffries do by these present appoint Benedict G. Burgess of Northumberland County, Virginia, our Agent and Attorney [the rest not transcribed] [21 June 1843]
