Agreeable to an order of his Excellency the Governor to disband the Illinois Regiment the terms of those Inlistments being expired by the conclusion of the War Frederick Rath Soldier in said Regiment & in lieut Richard Clark's [X149] Company is hereby discharged having Served from the Sixteenth day of July one thousand seven hundred & eighty to the date hereof and having received no pay or Cloathing except the Articles enumerated on the back of this discharge.

Given under my hand at Fort Nelson [present Louisville KY] this fifteen day of February one thousand seven hundred & eighty four.
