James Hawkins maketh oath in open court that William Roberts served in the continental army of the United States and was enlisted for during the war, the time of his service commenced in the year of 1777 and he served until he died a prisoner, taken by the British Troops at the surrender of Charleston [12 May 1780], he served in the company of Captain Henry Conway [W6719] who served under Colo. Charles Lewis [VAS901] and this Deponent maketh oath that Colo. Charles Lewis the officer who served in the fourteenth regiment of the Virginia Troops is dead as this deponent is informed & Believes [signed] James Hawkins
