Northumberland County State of Virginia To Wit

Be it Remembered that Before me James M Smith A Justice of the peace in and for the county aforesaid personally Appeared John Nash [S38254] an old Revolutionary Soldier and pentioner of the united States and upwards of Seventy years and made oath in due form of Law that he was well acquainted with Joseph Robinson who enlisted in the army in the Revolutionary War for three years and went in the army under cor'l Gaskins [Lt Col Thomas Gaskins BLWt867-450] from Northumberland and served out the full Turm of three years and then enlisted for and During the War. Was in the seige at Charlestown where he was taken prisoner [12 May 1780] and after the War clos'd he was Regularly discharged being in actual survice to the best of my knowledge at least seven years Given under my hand this 12 day of September 1831 J M Smith
