THESE are to CERTIFY that the bearer hereof George Salmon, a Serjeant in the first Virginia regiment, having fatihfully served the United States from the 15th September 1777 & afterwards reinlisted and being inlisted for the war, is hereby discharged from the American army.

Given at the war office the 8th day of August 1783. By order of the secretary at war, B Lincoln [Benjamin Lincoln] Jos. Carlton Sec'y Registered in the books of the regiment, [blank] adjutant Sam'l Finley Major [Samuel Finley W10026]

THE within CERTIFICATE shall not avail the bearer as a discharge, until the ratification of the definitive treaty of peace; previous to which time, and until proclamation thereof shall be made, he is to be considered as being on furlough. B. LINCOLN.
