I, David Nowlin Clerk of the Circuit Cout of said County, do certify that it is proven in open court, to the satisfaction of said Court that John B. Saucier was a private in the Revolutionary War in the Illinois regiment commanded by Col. George Rogers Clarke [sic: George Rogers Clark VAS269]; that he continued in the service from three to four years, when the Regiment was discharged, and that he never received a Warrant for the Bounty Land promised him, either on the Part of the United States or the State of Virginia, nor did he ever transfer his claim to it in any manner whatsoever. It is further proven that the within named John B. Saucier died intestate and that the only Heirs left are Mathiew Saucier & Brigitte Leconte.
