Loudoun County to wit

The Deposition of Thomas Hetherly [S2612] aged fifty four years, Deposeth and saith that he the said Thos Hetherly was well acquainted with Richard Savage when he was a Soldier in the Revolutionary War and that he often heard the said Richard Savage say that he was for dureing the war, which Inlistment took place In January in the year One thouand seven hundred and seventy seven this Deponant further saith that he is certain that the said Richard Savage was in the service and had been upward of three years in the service when he this deponant had got his Discharge, and that he Left the said Richard Savage in the Army, this Deponant also saieth that he was Informed some time afterward the said Richard Savage was killed in the Arma [sic] before the End of the Revolutionary War – and further this Deponant Saith not Thomas his Xmark Hetherly

The above Deposition was signed and sworn to before us the subscribers Justices of the peace for the Cou'ty of Loud'n this 11 day of April 1810
