I do hereby certify that Henry Scott enlisted a soldier in the 9<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment on Continental establishment the latter end of the year 1775 or beginning of the year 1776 and that he died in the said service. Given under my hand at the county of Accomack in the state of Virginia the 5<sup>th</sup> of February 1811.

[The following is in the file of the above Henry Scott, but it apparently pertains to Henry Scott VAS4371.] By the books of this Office it appears that on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of September 1810 a warrant issued to Henry Scott for 200 acres, in consideration of his service for 3 years as a Sergeant, and was delivered to him the same day. no other warrant appears to have issued to Henry Scott, or any other person, in consideration of military services performed by any person of the name Henry Scott.
