Personally came before me a Justice of the peace in and for the County of Allegheny & Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Jacob Springer [S40495] an Ensign of the 9th Virginia Regiment on his solemn oath saith that Henry Scott was a Soldier in the ninth Regiment and none but him of that name in s'd Regiment and also this deponant knew s'd Henry Scott to be of good character

Sworn & subscribed before me this 5th June 1810

Thomas [undeciphered]

I do hearby Certify that Henry Scott did Serve as Sergant in the 9 Virginia Reg't in Capt James Neal's [S38257] Company and that he did Behve [behave] him self as a good Soldiar Given under my hand this forth day of July 181 [sic]

Rob't Vance [Robert Vance VAS348] Late Capt in the 9 Virginia Regt

I Certify that Henry Scott was a Soldier in Captain James Neel's Company in the thirteenth Virginia Regiment and that he served through the Campaigns 1777, 1778 & 1779 but I do not recolect at what time he was discharged; but I beleive early in the year 1780.

It does not appear that Henry Scott has drawn a Warrant for his bounty in land Land Off 5th Sept. 1810 Chas Blagrove Reg

[The following is in the file of a Henry Scott (VAS4370) who died in service.] By the books of this Office it appears that on the 5th day of September 1810 a warrant issued to Henry Scott for 200 acres, in consideration of his service for 3 years as a Sergeant, and was delivered to him the same day. no other warrant appears to have issued to Henry Scott, or any other person, in consideration of military services performed by any person of the name Henry Scott.
