The Court on proof thereof made, do order it to be certified in favor of Mary Ann Scurlock, that she is widow of James Scurlock, who enlisted as a Soldier for the term of three years in the Service of the United States, and dyed as such whereby she is entitled as such, to the emoluments by the law in such Case allowed

I do Certify that I inlisted James Scurlock some time in June or July 1777 to serve in the 15 Vir Regment three years or during the war. I have since been informed he Dide in the Service
