John Slate a Corporal in the 11<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment [in the] Service of the United States haveing serv'd faithfully [illegible] years) the term of his enlistment, is now discharged from any future services in said Regiment. Given under my hand at Camp this 1<sup>st</sup> day of December 1779.

I John Goodrum Sr. [S8589] State of Virginia & County of Greensville do hereby certify that I was in the service with John Slate in the revolutionary war we both belonged to the 15<sup>th</sup> Reg't on continantal establishment commanded by Colo. David Mason [VAS506]. The said Slate enlisted as a Souldier for Three years in Capt. James Mason's [VAS4005] Company and joined the grand army under Gen'l. Washington in June 1777 and I believe served his time out faithfully and [undeciphered word] as orderly Sargent as I understood.
