State of Virginia

Gloucester County Sct [7 March 1832]

The deposition of William Figg of the age of sixty nine years Taken before the undersined two justices of the peace for the County aforesaid

This deponent being first duly sworn deposeth and saith that he was well acquainted with John Stubbs he enlisted of the Revolutionary war and he went to the north and there was killed and never returned I do not recollect what Cap he served under but I do know he enlisted for the war and never Returned and served until he was killed

Reed Pursell and Jas Pursell who made application for compensation is the only heirs of John Stubbs above mentioned he only had one sister Mary Stubbs John Stubbs never maried and the above named Reed Pursell & Jas Pursell are the only heirs of his sister Mary Stubbs and further this deponent saith not and for greater certainty hath subscribed his name by making his mark
