I certify that Arthur Smith entered as a cadet in the Company of Rich'd Meade [Richard Kidder Meade VAS625] in the Second Reg't in September 1775. that he march'd to the great Bridge and in the action with the 14<sup>th</sup> British Reg't & Tories [9 Dec 1775] he was wounded & continued attached to that Reg't until he was appointed a Captain in the 4<sup>th</sup> under Colo. Adam Stephen that I saw him in Jersey in the summer of 1778; that in 1780 in Arnolds [Benedict Arnold, 30 Dec 1780] or Leslies [Alexander Leslie, 30 Oct 1780] invasion [of Virginia] I saw him acting as Captain under General [Peter] Muhlenberg & that to my knowledge he held no Militia Commission in the County in which he resided which was in Isle of Wight. given under my hand this 22<sup>d</sup> day of February 1808.
