These are to Certify that Charles Smith formily a Soldier in the fifth Virginia Regiment has Duly & faithfully served his the term of Three years for which he Inlisted in Consequence of which & at his own Request is herby Discharged from any farther Service in the Army of the United States & Permitted to Return to his home free & unmolested he having Receved all his bounty pay and Clothing & Deficiences of pay & Clothing in full of all Provisions made by the Congress for their Troops Given under my hand at Philadelphia January 29th 1780
