This is to Certify that Enoch Smith a gunner in Colo. Marshall's [Thomas Marshall VAS494] Regment of Artillrey have due him from the State of Virginia one Coat one Vest on pr Breeches two shirts two pr stockings Two prs shoes & one hatt Manuy africant

Yancey Lipscomb [Yancy Lipscomb 874-050103] Capt 1st VSA Richmond September 5<sup>th</sup> 17[??]

The memorial of Hedgman Smith the son, Heir, & administrator of of Enock Smith dec'd late of Fauquier & State of Virginia, for the purpose of obtaining Land bounty from the State of Virginia for his services during the Revolution makes the following declaration this 6 day of August 1835. Towit. That I Hedgman Smith of Fauquier county & State of Virginia, and the son, one of the Heirs, & the administrator of the above named Enock Smith, supposed to be entitled to Bounty from the State aforesaid, for his services in the revolutionary war, for & during the continuance thereof, in the Redg't of Artilery commanded at one time by Col. Tho Marshal, & inlisted in the first instance by Capt Elias Edmonds [VAS2004] in his company at Fauquier Court House State of Virginia in or about August 1777 for 3 years or during the war, in which corpse as Gunner he appeared to remain untill 5 September 1780 as pr. act of clothing found among his papers by the administrator, & that he remained to the end of the war I have no doubt from my information [undeciphered word] my knowledge when and where his services were performed I must refer to the depositions accompanying this memorial as it was before my day & therefore cannot speak with certainty in the matter but recollect that I have often heard my Fahter say that he was at the Siege of York [Yorktown, 28 Sep - 19 Oct 1781].

The claimants and Heirs of Enock Smith above refered to are as follows Hedgman Enock the son and the administrator, is a resident of Fauquier county & State of Virginia, John O Smith, Elijah Smith, Isham Smith, Elias Smith, sons and Heirs of Enock Smith, & Lucinda Ball now the wife of Tho. Ball an Heir & Daughter of Enock Smith are all Kentuckyans at this time, given under my hand & seal this day & year above written. [signed] Hedgman Smith [Certified before William R. Smith, Justice of the Peace.]
