I Cawfeld Taylor do voluntarily enlist myself into Captain Sam'l Walker [Samuel Walker S39117] Company of Foot, belonging to Colonel NATHANIEL GIST'S [Nathaniel Gist BLWt1874-500] Regiment, in the Service of the United States of *America*, to continue for three years and to be subject to such Rules and Articles as are or shall be established by Congress. Witness my Hand this 21st Day of March A.D 1777



and puntuall In his duty and well supprted the Caracter of [undeciphered] and good soulder Untill Legally discharged and I Do Certify that he never Recv'd aney Bounty Land given Under My hand and sale the danneed Walker
