The affidavit of Leonard Shackelford [S6085] of the County of King and Queen and State of Virginia This affiant being first duly sworn according to law States upon oath, that I was a revolutionary Pensioner going on Seventy six years of age, and that he was well acquainted with Edmund Taylor who was a resident of the aforesaid County of King & Queen. That the said Taylor Enlisted for two years in the revolutionary war some time in the years 1776 or 1777 in Capt Gregory Smiths Company who was that time a Capt. in the 7th Va Regiment commanded by Holt Richerson [Holt Richeson VAS1954], upon Continental Establishment and went to the North, where he the said Taylor served [his] time fully out, and then reenlisted at the White Marsh in Pensylvania, under Capt Thomas Hill in the Continental line for during the War. but what regiment he belonged during the last enlistment he the said Shackelford does not know, but well remembers that the said Taylors Regiment was one of the regiments which was ordered to the South the said Shackelford further states that the said Taylor served his last time of enlistment out, that is to say he served to the end of the War. and further this affiant saith not Sworn and subscribed this 9th day of April 1834 before me
