Hillary Mears [S18508] a militia pensioner & a man of truth & veracity came before me & made oath that Giles Taylor of this Co. enlisted in the 9th Va Reg't for the term of during the War & served until the War ended & returned to the County after the termination of the war as he distinctly recollects. Given under my hand & seal as a Justice of the peace in & for Accomack County Jany 21st 1834. Wm R Custis

Robert Russell Sen'r [W5753] a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity came before me & made oath that Giles Taylor of this County enlisted in the 9th Virginia Regiment for the term of during the war & served til the end of the War in that & the 1st Va Reg't. Given under my hand & seal as a Justice of the peace in & for s'd County this 21st day of January 1834. Wm R Custis

Severn Scott [S38355] a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity came before me & made oath that he served in the 9th Va Reg't & recollects Giles Taylor – that said Giles Taylor enlisted in said Reg't as this deponent believes for the term of the War & this deponent returned in 1779 & left said Taylor in Service & believes he continued in service till the War ended. Given under my hand & seal as a Justice of the peace in & for said County this 21st day of January 1834. Wm R Custis

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Continental Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 8th day of January 1785, in the name of Giles Taylor as a Soldier of Infantry for £15.17.4, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to Colo. Cropper [John Cropper W3781] and was given for services prior to the 1st January, 1782.
