Elcany Andrews [Elkanah Andrews S6507] who is a credible Witness came before me & made oath that he served on board the galley "Accomack" whilst she was in service & that Severn Taylor enlisted on board the same galley when she was manned & remained in service till s'd galley was laid up, a period of nearly or quite four years. Witness my hand & seal this 19th Sep'r 1832 at Accomack County.

William Thornton Sen'r aged upwards of 75 years and who is a man of unquestionable veracity came before me & made oath that Severn Taylor enlisted on board the "Accomack" galley when she was first manned & remained on board said galley till she was dismantled & laid up, a period of from three to four years as witness my hand & seal this 23^d Sep'r 1832 at Accomack Co.
