The affidavit of Hartwell Savedge [S7452] of the County of Surry of Virginia taken at the dwelling house of Jesse King in said County the 28th day of May 1834. The affiant being duly sworn saith that he is now in the seventy eighth year of his age, that he was well acquainted with Philip Thompson of the said County before the revolutionary War, and that he knows that he the said Thompson inlisted in the Company of State line troops on Continental establishment which was raised and commanded by Captain John Watkins [VAS3230] in the year 1776 and went in the said Company to the North and there died as this affiant understood, he never Came back, he enlisted for three years.

Traving accord

The affidavit of Jesse King [S5559] of the county of Surry in Virginia taken at his dwelling house in the said county the 28th day of May 1834–

The affiant being duly sworn saith that he is in the seventy ninth year of his age, and that he was well acquainted with Phillip Thompson of the said county before and during the Revolutionary War, that he knows that the said Thompson inlisted in the company of state line troops on continental establishment raised & commanded by Captain John Watkins, and went in the said company to the north & was attached to the fourth Virginia Regiment, and while in the said service he died; as this this affiant believes, he enlisted for three years and when the rest were discharged it was said Phillip Thompson was dead.
