Mathews county to wit

This day personally appeared before me John N. Sale a Justice of the peace for the said County William Diggs [William Digges S8327] in his seventy third year of age and deposed that he well knew John Treackle of the Parish of Kingston in the county of Gloucester now Mathews county and knows that he served a tour of three years in the regular army during the Revolutionary War and that he knew no other man by that name Given under my hand & seal this 16th day of March 1833

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia State Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 29th day of May 1783, in the name of John Trickle as a Soldier of Infantry for £66.13.5, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to James Haskins and was given for services prior to the 1st January, 1782.
