Waggoner Serj't who died in the service[?] & that the s'd Andrew hath Rec'd no pention for the same. Given under our hands this 16 day of Sep. 1784 M. Morgan/Geo. Cunningham

I do Certify that Wm. Waggoner entered the service in the fall 1776 for 2 years at the end of the 2 years entered for 18 months in March 1780 Reinlisted for the war & dyed in May 1782 at Charles Town [Charleston SC]. 27 Sep'r 1784 A. Waggoner late Maj'r Sep'r 30 1784 En'd. pass'd S. Hawes Com'r. [Samuel Hawes BLWt1066-450]
