William Pound [R8388] came into Court and made oath that George Wale Sarved as a Soldier for three years in the first Virginia State Regiment under the Command of Captain Gabriel Jones [VAS1276] in that Regiment Commanded by Colonel George Gibson [BLWt1985-500] And Timothy Wale came into court and Satisfied the Court that the said George Wale has departed this life and that he is his heir at law Teste Wm. Broadus

## Culpeper County to wit

Before me John Shaw a Justice of the peace for said County personally appear Lawson Whale and James Brown and severally made Oath that Timothy Whale [sic] mentioned in the within affidavit is the eldest Brother living and heir a Law to his Brother George Whale, who died a soldier in the Revolutionary War in or about the year 1780 in the hospital in the Town of Redin [sic: Reading] Pennsylvania Certified under my hand thi 13<sup>th</sup> day of November 1812 John Shade
