It appears by the Books in this Office that David Wallace a Lieut. in the Virginia line on continental establishment drew a certificate of one hundred pounds sixteen shillings on the 28th April 1784 for the balance of his full pay.

I Do hereby Certify that David Wallace now Deceased served in my Comp'y as a Serg't in the year 1776 in the 12th Virginia Reg't on Continental Establishment untill November 1778 when Advanced to a Lieutenants Command in which line he served untill the last of s'd year he Continued under my Command and afterwards served in the same Capacity at the Siege of York [Yorktown, 28 Sep - 19 Oct 1781] was in the whole a good Soldier and officer
