13th November 1797

I do certify to the best of my recollection that Allen Waller was commissioned in the Third Virginia Regiment in the late Continental Army Ensign and I believe died while in the service in the year one Thousand Seven hundred and seventy six.

I do hereby certify that I was well acquainted with a Mr. Allen Waller who at or about the commencement of the Revolutionary war was appointed to the commission of Ensign to a company Commanded by Captain William Washington raised in Stafford County in the third Virginia Reg't commanded by Col. Hugh Mercer, who marched to the north with said Reg't and from the best information I was able to receive on the subject he was afterward promoted to a Lieutenancy and died in the service before his return home. Given from under my hand at Stafford Court House this 12th day of Novem'r 1821. Peter Hansbrough
