I do hereby Empower and request Thomas Peyton to settle with and receive from the Continental Commissioner Certificates for Job Warfords pay as a soldier in the Continental Army Given under my hand this 29<sup>th</sup> day of March 1785

Abraham Warford

Loudoun County April 20th 1785.

I do hereby Certify that Job Warford was Drafted from the militia of said county the 19<sup>th</sup> March 1781 to serve in the Cont'l. Army the Term of Eighteen Months [signed] Francis Peyton C.L.L.M.

I do Certify that Job Warford an Eighteen Month Soldier from Loudoun County has served his time fully Given under my hand this 12<sup>th</sup> day of April 1785
