[Certified in Fayette County PA before James Neal, Justice of the Peace, 9 May 1786]

I do hereby Certify that William Wood a Soldier in Capt James Hooks [James Hook (Hooke) S39713] Company in the 13<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regement, was inlisted in the month of Jan'ry 1777 for three years and that he was discharged by Lieut Col. Richard Campbell [BLWt347-450] in March 1780 which discharge was put into my hands in order to settle his accompts Settled which I have lost or so mislaid it that it Cannot be come at Given under my hand this 9<sup>th</sup> day of may 1786.
