I certify that previous to the raising of the first Regiment of Virginia Regular Troops commanded by Colo. Patrick Henry in the Revolutionary War, Tarlton Woodson, served in a Volunteer Company commanded by Capt. Charles Scott [BLWt2055-850] (now Gov'r. of Kentucky). That the said Tarlton Woodson was appointed an Ensign in a company of the said first Regiment, & went into service [undeciphered] in fall of 1775. That during the time of my presence in the neighbourhood of york town [Yorktown] where the enemy was taken in Octo. 1781 the said Tarlton Woodson was there & spoke to me on this subject of – diferences which had take place between him & Colo. Moses Hazen [W27620], of whose Regiment he was a Major. so far falls within my actual knowledge – Given under my hand this 26 Dec'r. 1808. E. Carrington [Edward Carrington W6635]
