Pension application of Thomas Russel VAS92 Transcribed by Will Graves SLV1VA 8/18/12

Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

These are to Certify that Thomas Russel Formerly a Soldier in the 8th Virginia Regiment has dutifully and faithfully Served the Term of three years for which he was enlisted. In consequence of which and at his own Request he is hereby Discharged from any further Service in the Army of the United States and permitted to Returned to his home free and unmolested – he having Received all his Ballance of pay and Clothing and Deficiency of pay and Clothing in full of all Allowances and Provisions made by the Congress for their Troops – his Receipt for which is on the Back hereof. Given under my hand at Philadelphia this 3rd day of February 1780
