Col. Armstrong [James Armstrong]⁴ listed one lieutenant and 11 rank and file killed; 1 colonel, 1 lt. colonel, 1 major, 1 captain, 1 ensign, 5 sergeants and 28 rank and file wounded

Genl. Butler [John Butler] listed 2 rank and file killed; 2 captains, 1 ensign and 17 rank and file wounded

Colonels Malmedy [Francis de Malmedy, Marquis of Bretagne] and Henderson [?] listed 2 rank and file killed; and 9 rank and file wounded.

Total Casualties shown in the return: 1 Lieutenant killed; 15 rank and file killed
