NOTES:

This muster roll is in the <u>rejected claim in the Library of Virginia</u> by heirs of Maj. John Patter (BLWt1725-400). It is a complement to an undated "Arrangement of the Officers of the Delaware Regiment who continue in actual Service, it being arranged to four Companies, by the Secretary at War" (http://revwarapps.org/b190.pdf).

Comparison with a muster roll of commissioned officers and staff for January and February 1780 (http://revwarapps.org/b189.pdf), before the Delaware Regiment marched South, shows the devastating effect of the defeat of the Southern Department under Gen. Horatio Gates at the Battle of Camden SC on 16 August 1780. See also the incomplete "Muster of Delaware Casualties, Camp near Charlotte (NC) December 4th, 1780" (http://revwarapps.org/b188.pdf).

As a result of losses at the Battle of Camden the Delaware Regiment was reduced to a single company commanded by Capt. Robert Kirkwood, which was attached to the Maryland Continental regiment commanded by Col. Otho Holland Williams. As such it generally provided infantry support to Lt. Col. William Washington's Third Regiment of Continental Light Dragoons, performing admirably at the battles of Cowpens, Guilford Courthouse, and Eutaw Springs.
