- Trumpeter John George Hiller, still in company in 1782. [John George Hiller (Heiler) S2305]
- Corporal David Ekstine Philadelphia, July 12, 1778 [no pension records found under that name]
- Corporal John Ignatius Effingar Pottsgrove, Aug 1, 1778, discharged, July1783; resided in Woodstock, Shenandoah County, VA in 1834 [W7087 discharged in August 1781]
- Corporal Anthony Wachter Philadelphia, July 10, 1778 [no pension records under that name]
- Corporal Jacob Shafer Philadelphia, July 1, 1778 [no pension records under that name]
- Corporal Philip Smith Philadelphia, July 10, 1778; resided in Berks County in 1835, aged 81 [W6097 discharged in August 1781 before Yorktown]

- Private John Adams Philadelphia, July 12, 1778 [no pension records under that name]
- Private George Anthony died in Jackson County, Ohio on Aug 15, 1833, aged 79 [no pension records under that name]
- Private Jacob Baclet (or Barlet) [pensioned under the name Jacob Barlett or Barlet W4882 for service in Von Heer's troop commencing in April 1782. Therefore, he wasn't in service at the time of Cornwallis' surrender at Yorktown. This file contains a discharge signed by George Washington. Page 36]
- Private Henry Barth (or Bard or Brath) out July 1, 1782 [pensioned under the name Henry Beard, or Beaird or Baird R668 for three years service under Von Heer, but discharged before Yorktown; widow Elizabeth denied a pension.]
- Private Stephen Barth (or Bard or Brath) Lancaster, May 15, 1779 out May15, 1782; resided in Berks County in 1835, aged 81 [Stephen Barth (Baird) S39959]
- Private John Bauman [John Baumann] Philadelphia, Sept 1, 1779 [no pension records under that name]
- Private Lewis Boyer resided in Miami County, Ohio in 1842; died in 1842 [Lewis Boyer (Boyers) S46370]
- Private Peter Brown [no pension records under that name]
- Private Joseph Buob still in company 1782 [no pension records under that name]
- Private John Burkhardt [John Fredrick Bickhart] enlisted November 1, 1778 from Reading,

PA; born 1753 in Switzerland and died 1847 in Sandusky, Ohio; [pensioned under the name John Frederick Beekarth, S39978; discharged August 1<sup>st</sup> 1781]<sup>i</sup>

- Private Peter Cryobck died June 21, 1822 in Berks County, PA, aged 81 [no pension records under that name]
- Private Sebastian Curutz [Cunitz]– Reading, Apr 1, 1780 still in company in 1782 [no pension records under that name]
- Private Christian Dareler-Hessen Philadelphia Sept 1, 1778; died July 20, 1821, Lebanon County, aged 71[sic, Christian Dentzler W3134—he says he was discharged in August 1781 before Yorktown]–
- Private John Durie Philadelphia Sept 1, 1778 [no pension records under that name]
- Private John Eicholtz [Eickhols] Somerset Feb 15, 1778 [John Eickhols (Eichholtz) S42699]<sup>1</sup>
- Private Andrew Eisnack [no pension records under that name]
- Private John Engelhaupt Mt. Pleasant July 1, 1779; promoted to corporal; out Jul 1, 1782 John Engelhaupt (Engelhault) W2776
- Private Adam Fox resided in Berks County, PA in 1835. [Adam Fox W7293]
- Private David Fox (or Fuchs) from Reading, PA, 1778, Trumpeter; resided in Berks County, PA in 1835; age 69 [W3340 enlisted for 16 months in 1782]
- Private Jacob Fox (or Fuchs) from Reading, PA, 1779; resided in Shenandoah County, VA in 1829 [Jacob Fox [Fuchs] S49271]
- Private Henry Frank Hessen Nov 15, 1778 [Henry Frank S10700]
- Private Henry Franforter [Henry Frankfort] Lancaster Aug 31, 1778; resided in Dauphin County in 1838, aged 81 [Henry Frankfort (Frankford) S41548]
- Private George Fricker resided in Reading, PA in 1787 [no pension records under that name]
- Private Peter Fricker died Dec 26, 1827 in Berks County, PA; age 62 [S41546 enlisted in 1782 & served 16 months]
- Private John Gerlach Pottsgrove July 1,1778 [George Gerlach or Gerlack S10179; no pension application; records indicate that he was pension by the federal government on account of disability, from January 1, 1791, under the Act of June 7, 1785. There are no records in this file.<sup>2</sup>]
- Private Henry Ginser [S31064 but he does not claim to have served under Von Heer or to have

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> He states in his pension application under the 1818 Act that he served under "Captain Vanhier" in a company of Dragoons but does not state the time of his service or whether or not he was at Yorktown with Von Heer. In his 1820 application he states he was a state pensioner in Pennsylvania at the rate of \$40 per year. <sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> The reason there are no surviving papers relating to this bounty land claim is that the offices of the War Department along with the papers filed there were destroyed by fire in 1800 and all pension and bounty land records predating that fire were destroyed. Further, pension and bounty land papers generated between the fire of 1800 and 1814 were lost when the British burned Washington DC on August 14, 1814.

- Private Andrew O'Bryan [pensioned under the name Andrew O'Brien S40216 for 15 months service in Von Heer's Troop and discharged at the end of the war. Not at Yorktown.]
- Private Peter Ox 1782; resided in Hunting County, PA in 1818. [S40233—says he joined Von Heer's company in 1782 and served in the 'suit of his Excellency General Washington']
- Private Robert Pape had not received bounty in 1782 [no pension records under that name]

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> His pension application dated 1818 reads in part as follows: "That he enlisted into the service at the Borough of Lancaster in the State of Pennsylvania in the year 1778 in a company of Cavalry commanded by Captain Thomas Van Hairs [sic, Bartholomew Von Heer] – That about Six months after enlistment deponent received by the hands of his Captain aforesaid a Cornet's Commission signed, as deponent believes, by Gover Reed [Governor Joseph Reed], the then Governor of the State of Pennsylvania – That he continued in said Company in the service of the United States, first as a "Provost Guard" and afterwards as the body Guard of General Washington, until the latter part of the year 1780, when deponent resigned in consequence of the Captain having drawn the pay for his Company and applied it to his own use without paying off his men –..."]
