On this 16<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year one thousand Eight hundred and fifty five before the undersigned a justice of the peace in and for the county and state aforesaid personally appeared George W Adams and Polley Adams the only children and heirs at Law of Benjamin Adams deceased a private soldier in the virginia line in the war of the Revolution and a Revolutionary Pensioner of the United States from Jessamine County Kentucky under act of Congress 18<sup>th</sup> March 1818 they believe their father served as aforesaid & was a pensioner as aforesaid and that he died on or about the 25<sup>th</sup> of June 1846 leaving no widow and only affiants as the living children and heirs at law. affiants has often heard their said father say there was some Money and Land due and comeing to him from the government of the United States for his services aforesaid affiants further say they reside in the county of Jessamine and State of Kentucky

They make this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the amount of Money or Bounty Land due and comeing to them for the services of their said father.
