I do hereby Certify that Mister Thomas Payne entered in my Company of regular Troops (raised by an act of the General Convention of the State of Virginia for the General defense of then the Colonies of America) as cadet the 29th day of January 1776 & continued until the end of the war at which time he held the rank of Captain in the Continental Line. Given under my hand this 21st day of July 1794
