[The following documents MAY relate to the above referenced officer:

I hereby Certify that Thomas Parker Esquire was appointed an Ensign in the 2nd Virginia Regiment on Continental establishment on or about the 1st day of January 1777 and that he continued in service until the Army was disbanded on or about the 3rd day of November 1783 at which time he had the Rank of a Captain. Given under my hand this 19th day of June 1807.

It appears from the Records of Military Warrants, that Captain Thomas Parker has drawn a Warrant for 4000 acres for three years Service – and afterwards a warrant for 4666 2/3 acres issued in the same name for seven years Service.

Extract of a letter from Colonel Thomas Parker – 7th August

"I only yesterday received yours of the 21st ultimo I thank you for your attention to my business at the land office. I received a warrant in June 1783 for 4000 Acres of Land, which is all I ever received from the State of Virginia. The Warrant issued in April 1784 for 4666 2/3 acres I presume was in favor of Captain Thomas Parker of the 9th Regiment who lives on the Eastern Shore. This is the more probable as his certificate is signed by Major Snead who belonged to the same Regiment & whom I had never seen. I will thank you to explain this business fully to the Governor and Council – All the old officers in Richmond or elsewhere know me and know that I could no [not] be guilty of a dishonorable action. They also know that there was in the Army another Officer of the name, Rank & name. I necessarily apply to Moseley Vandaval Gamble &c"
