Bounty Land Warrant information relating to Thomas Wishart BLWt1795-200 f19VA

I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]

Chapter 157 (XII) An act to authorize the Comptroller of the Treasury to settle the account of Thomas Wishart, late a Lieutenant in the Army of the United States
Sect. 1-- Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the Comptroller of the Treasury be, and hereby is, authorized to adjust and settle the account of Thomas Wishart, late a Lieutenant in the Army of the United States, and to allow him, in addition to the pay, to which he may be entitled as an Officer deranged, under the Acts of Congress of the year 1778, the pay of a Lieutenant from the 15th day of October 1780, to the 15th day of October, 1781.

State of Virginia County of King George: SS

I Sidney Wishart of Stafford County a cousin and one of the heirs at law of Thomas Wishart late of the County of King George and State of Virginia but now deceased, do, upon oath testify and declare that to the best of my knowledge and belief the said Thomas Wishart was a Lieutenant in the 15th Virginia Regiment which regiments were deranged in 1779 and reduced to eleven regiments of Infantry, on the Continental establishment – during the Revolutionary War, and I do further testify and declare, that I have never received a warrant from the United States for the quantity of land due the said deceased from the United States, nor do I believe that he ever received it, or transferred his right to it in any manner during his life time.

Therefore ... [there follows a boilerplate power of attorney which I have elected not to transcribe by which Col. Joseph Watson was appointed power for the claimant.]

[p 6: On September 27, 1831 in King George County Virginia, James G Taliaferro and Gus B. Wallace gave testimony that Thomas Wishart died __leaving no widow or children and that Sydney Wishart of Stafford County and Wilhelmina Taliaferro (formerly Wilhelmina Wishart) of King George County are the only heirs at law of the said Thomas Wishart.]

I William Hofler [William Hoffler S38047] who was a Captain in the first Virginia State Regiment under Colo. George Gibson [BLWt1985-500], during the Revolutionary War, do certify that Thomas Wishart was a Lieutenant for at least three years in the 15th Regiment of Virginia on Continental Establishment. I do also certify that Elizabeth Wishart of Norfolk County is the Heir at Law of the said Thomas Wishart.
