Bounty Land Warrant information relating to Zachariah Tatum BLWt1955-150 f11VA Transcribed by Will Graves 11/8/11: rev'd 1/30/22

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' or 'undeciphered' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention. Researchers should not rely solely on the transcripts but should review the originals for themselves. These transcripts are intended as an aid to research, not to be used in lieu thereof.]

State of Virginia County of Henrico

I Henry W Tatum only heir at law of his Zachariah Tatum deceased do upon my oath declare and testify, that, to the best of my knowledge and belief, the said Zachariah Tatum entered the service of the United States in the Virginia line in the year 1779 or thereabouts as an Ensign and served in the Regiment, No. 5 under Colonel Russell [William Russell] as an Ensign until about 1782 and then under the command of Colonel Mathews [George Matthews] of the said Regiment as a Lieutenant of the Continental line, and that he continued in the service until the War ended. I further declare that I have never received a warrant for the Bounty Land promised to said Zachariah Tatum on the part of the United States; nor do I believe that he ever received it, or transferred his claim to it in any manner whatsoever: Therefore know all Men by these Presents that I Henry W Tatum aforesaid do hereby constitute and appoint Vespasian Ellis of Accomack, Virginia, to be my true and lawful Attorney for me and in my name to demand and receive of from the Secretary of War of the United States; a warrant for the quantity of land due to me aforesaid; and my said attorney is hereby fully authorized and empowered to constitute and appoint one or more substitutes or attorneys under him for the special purposes above expressed.
