Bounty Land Warrant information relating to James Simmons BLWt2387-100 f7VA Transcribed by Will Graves 2/15/12

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

[f p. 4: Power of attorney dated November one, 1845 executed in Norfolk County Virginia by James Simmons who states that he is an heir at law of James Simmons deceased. He declares that James Simmons deceased entered the service for the term of during the war and was a soldier in the Virginia Continental line.

[Power of attorney also signed by Eliza Ann Brown, but there is no statement as to what, if any, basis for a claim she might have to the bounty land for services of James Simmons, deceased. She signed with her mark.]

[f p. 7; Note: "For the proof of service and of airship in the case of James Simmons deceased who was a soldier of the Virginia line, refer to the papers in the case of Williamson Simmons deceased, to whose there's was granted land Warrant No. 2386, for 100 acres, on the 21st of March 1846."]
