Letter dated May 22, 1936 in response to an inquiry regarding this veteran reads in relevant part as follows:

"Richard C. Walters B. L. Wt.#2432-100

The records showed that bounty land warrant No. 2432 for two hundred acres of bounty land was issued on account of the service of Richard C Walters as Lieutenant in the Virginia line. The warrant was issued July 18, 1791 to George Chandler, assignee.

There are no statements on file which were made by this officer at the time of his application for land because of the destruction of papers when the War Office was burned in 1800, therefore this office has no further information in regard to him."
