Lexington State of Kentucky Fayette County./ Sct.

This day came Robert Wilmott before me Thos. Wallace a Justice of the peace for said County and acknowledged the above power of Attorney to James Morrison [not transcribed] to be his act and Deed and that it [one or two illegible words] wish it should be recorded and made oath that he is a Brother and legal heir to Captain William Willmott who was killed near Charleston some short time before the Close of the War with Great Britain. Given under my hand this fourth day of March 1806.

NOTE: According to Patrick O'Kelley, *Nothing But Blood and Slaughter*, Vol 4 (2005), Capt. William Wilmott of the 2nd Maryland Regiment under Col. Thaddeus Kosciuszko was killed in a battle on James Island SC on 14 Nov 1782. He was the last soldier killed in the Revolutionary War in the Carolinas.
