

[This veteran gave an affidavit in support of the pension claim of <u>John Brown S39242</u>. The affidavit reads as follows:



These are to Certify that Mr. John Brown was a soldier in the fifth Regiment of South Carolina Continental troops and Immediately after the Battle at Savannah he was transferred to my Company in the third Regiment Commanded by Colonel [illegible name, may be William Henderson] and That he faithfully Served his time a Good Soldier in the same, and after we were taken prisoners at the fall of Charleston he continued as a waiter to me until the Troops were Discharged at Charleston where he had his Discharge, he is a man about 5 feet Eight or ten

inches high of a sallow Complexion with Brown hair each made and at that time about Eighteen years of age – and that it is the same person who has called on me for this Certificate at this time. Sat. 5th Dec. 1818 S/ Jesse Baker
