Pension Application of Jedediah Cottle BLWt500-100 Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris

This to certify that Judjah Cottle (formerly of Greenbrier County Virginia was Inlisted in the Month of May in the year 1779 to serve during the war and joined my detached Regiment to the south and served with me until the 29<sup>th</sup> of May 1780 when he was killed at my defeat at Waxsaws [sic: Battle of Waxhaws SC] Given Under my hand this 3<sup>d</sup> day of April 1803 A Buford [Abraham Buford] late Col. 11<sup>th</sup> Virg'a Reg't.

## NOTES:

Jedediah Cottle appears to be the soldier mentioned in the pension application of Jacob Chapman (S19237) as follows: "I hired one Died Cottle to take my place, who done so and was killed whilst in service at Bluford defeat. I gave him \$1000— in continental money & had to sell my place to raise the money."

On 23 Jan 1810 William Cottle of Kanawha County (West) Virginia assigned power of attorney to obtain any benefits available for the service of his brother, Jedediah Cottle.
