State of Alabama Monroe County

On this 29th day of July 1856, before me, a Justice of the peace in and for the County and State above named, personally appeared Mary Thompson aged 80 years, a resident of Butler County Alabama, who being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of William Thompson who was a private in a company commanded by Captain Green that he volunteered in the State of South Carolina on or about the \_\_ day of \_\_ 1780, and continued in actual service 14 days, and was honorably discharged at Charleston SC, on or about the \_\_ day of \_\_ 1782, and she has never before made application for Bounty Land.

She further states that she was married to the said William Thompson in Georgia on the 5 day of December 1799 by one Joseph Phillips, that her name, before her said marriage, was Mary Patrick that her said husband died in Alabama on the 19 day of December 1848 [could be 1843, or 1846] and she is now a widow.
